- Lastly, include a brief evaluation of this story and pair it with a rating: 0 stars being the worst and 5 stars being the best.

As each student finishes presenting their poster, they will hang it on the art square (Example)



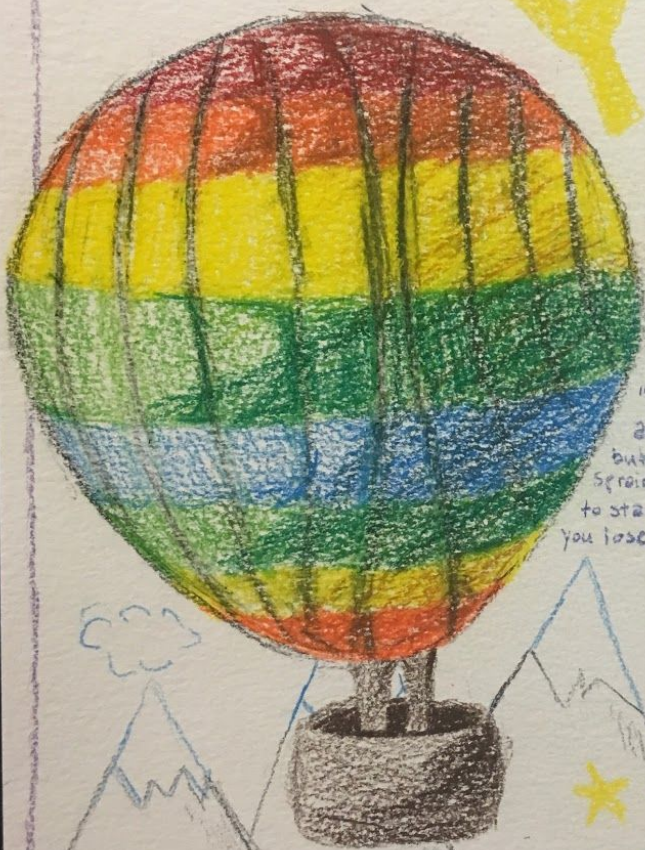
